The Results are in!

We have now received the confirmation of the pupils results from the last school year (School year 2009/2010). Pupils at Lowther have a deep commitment and enthusiasm for learning. Their attitude to school and to learning is extremely positive — this is vital. We have seen over time very good attainment and progress at Lowther — so much of this is down to your wonderful children's love of school and learning.

Pupils overall **attainment** in Key Stage 2 was significantly above the National Average and additionally significantly above the National average in <u>both</u> English and Maths. This is a fantastic achievement by the children. 95% of pupils achieved Level 4 or higher (the national average is 80%) in English and 95% of pupils achieved Level 4 or higher (again the national average is 80%) in Maths

The **progress** that learners make at Lowther continues to be outstanding. The value added ranking that recognises the progress children make has placed us in the following % nationally over the last 5 years

2010—Top 13% of schools (this is particularly good as 2010 was the first year Science was not included in the results - a subject we have ranked in the top 4% of schools nationally for the last 4 years!)

2009—Top 9% of schools

2008—Top 6% pf schools

2007—Top 1% of schools

2006—Top 3% of schools

When I have the full details of how pupils are progressing at Lowther I will share them with you via the newsletter.

I am though delighted that pupils at Lowther continue to sparkle academically as well as socially.

Attendance

Attendance is key for children to make great progress in their learning.

For the first half term the school attendance was **95.1%** - which is good—but we want it to be outstanding! We want to beat **96%** for the year. Please remember all absences from school <u>must</u> be authorised.

Week 1 after half term—we hit the magical 96% - with 3 classes— - getting a whopping 99% - awe-some! Let's keep up the outstanding work.

Over the last few years Lowther families have been recognised as bucking the national average for attendance as your children's attendance has improved year on year (last year we had **95.5%** - the national average was 93.8%) Thank you for your continued support with promoting the importance of excellent attendance.

Let's go on a trip!

At Lowther we are passionate about offering children the opportunity to learn in different ways whether that be working on the allotment, using drama or computers — learning can be approached in so many exciting and interesting ways. Our fantastic London location offers a wealth of opportunities for trips out to places of interest and invites to special visitors in to run workshops. Why not come along on one of the trips - we really value parent help on these exciting learning adventures. Did you know we had 13 different trips across the school in the first half term which ranged from trips to the Children's Proms at the Royal Albert Hall to river trips and exploring the Natural History Museum. We have 13 more planned for the second half term. That equates to 2 trips per week. Each class averaged a total of 10 trips over the last school year. This doesn't include all the other different learning opportunities like gardening, nature walks, trips to the library and so on. We are always interested to hear of new and exciting places to take the children so if you know of somewhere then please do let us know.
