Junior Maths Challenge Success 2012

I am proud to announce that our brightest mathematicians in Y5 and Y6 at Lowther achieved 2 silvers and 2 bronzes in this year's United Kingdom Mathematical Trust's Junior Maths Challenge. Over 240,000 pupils from across the UK sat the challenge with roughly the top 6% receiving a gold certificate, the next 13% silver and the next 21% bronze.

Our results are a cause for celebration. Seana and Jasper received silver, and Raouf and Victor were awarded bronze. The Junior Maths Challenge is aimed at those in Y7 and Y8, so this puts our performance in context!

I have included some sample questions, if you would like to have a go...

- Beatrix looks at the word JUNIOR in a mirror. How many of the reflected letters never look the same as the original, no matter how Beatrix holds the mirror?
- What is the smallest four-digit positive integer which has four different digits?

There are six more girls than boys in Miss Spelling's class of 24 pupils. What is the ratio of boys to girls in the class?
