LOST PROPERTY


Our lost property box is overflowing with lovely warm coats, jumpers and gloves! Please ensure all your child's belongings are clearly labelled. Thank you.

Secure line 2011-2012

At Lowther the safety of the children is of paramount importance. We review our site security very carefully and regularly and so thought it would be useful for parents to see the school's site security plan. The thick black line shows the school's secure line. Children cannot access outside of this area during school time. The lobby area is open as are the front gates so families can access Children's Centre services and also make general school enquiries. We also believe it shows the ethos of the Lowther School Family - that we are welcoming. No member of the public has any access to the main school and any area where the pupils are without



authorisation. Additionally no children can access the front of the school without parental or staff supervision. We hope this makes our school site safety a little clearer. Do come and see us if you'd like further clarification.

Late Day

Timekeeping is an essential life skill. School starts at 9.00am so arriving by 8.55am is essential. Wednesday 22nd February is 'Late Gate'. We will be monitoring time keeping closely in the coming weeks. It would be fantastic if every single pupil was on time and ready to learn at nine! Please help support your children with this.

Some things that may help you get to school on time

- Get everything ready the night before (eg uniform, PE kit, book bag, shoes!).
- Allowing plenty of time to get to school.
- Helping your child organise homework.
- Making sure you have time for breakfast.
- Making sure your child has enough rest and is not over stimulated by too much time on the computer or TV before bedtime.
- Establish a good bedtime routine. Even simple things like making sure the room is dark enough to enable your child to sleep well can make mornings easier and less of a struggle.

What should you do if you have a problem getting your child to school on time?

- Talk to your child first.
- Talk to your child's teacher
- Ask for help. Remember we are all here to help. We want to work together to find solutions so that little problems don't become BIG ones
