

- 1) Screen your Story Our annual story writing competition launches on the 16th January. We've had lots of winners before and hope to again this time out. The theme for the stories this year is "Families". Look out for more details coming soon.
- 2) Lowtherness Live! We are delighted to announce it's time again for Lowtherness Live! We're now in our eleventh year of Lowtherness Live and I'm sure the judges will see all the acts try and pull out all the stops to try and secure their spot in the grand final. Whatever your talent, whatever your skill, we'd love to see it. Children can enter the competition and perform any act of their choice—music, comedy, dancing, sports, magic, acting. Sign up sheets are on my office door. #### Did you know?

There are over 30 different home languages spoken by families in the Lowther community. That's absolutely incredible!

Secondary offers: The first round of offers for secondary schools comes out at the end of March. Please don't worry if your child isn't offered one of their top preferences in this first round. Experience has shown that places tend to become available a little bit later down the line. Do come and talk to me or the office team if you need any further advice on this matter.

Please also note that the deadline for Reception class places is the 15th January 2023 and offers usually come out in April.

#### General School Matters

At the start of the new year I thought I'd mention a couple of things we're noticing with uniform and other matters - please do note these core expectations.

Uniform matters:

- ALL uniform (including coats and hats) to be named please. We find a lot of unnamed jumpers and coats around school.
- Footwear remains the main issue with incorrect uniform.
- NO boots to be worn at school.
- No jewellery is allowed at school (except stud earrings) and watches
- No shoes with logos that are not in black.
- Shoes/trainers must be all one dark colour (ideally black)
- NO Lowther sports hoodies to be worn to school please these are just for PE lessons in the winter months.

Please note ALL packed lunch boxes should be stored carefully (before and after use). We also politely request that plastic bags are NOT used for packed lunches as this isn't in line with our school's attempts to minimise our use of single use plastics.

Before and after school

- NO ball games (unless at a sports club)
- Children should not use the swing and the large climbing frame equipment at this time.
- NO scooting or cycling on school grounds for safety reasons please.
