

The Lowther Family is passionate about doing what we can to look after our environment. The University of West England are doing some important research and have asked for our help. Their message is below

A message about future fundraising plans

Community

Our parent community has been amazingly supportive in lots of different ways towards the school. One of the ways is fundraising. Over the last few years the amount of funds parents have raised has been absolutely incredible.

As I'm sure you are aware school budgets are challenging at the moment and so your support and help is even more vital to us at this time. We are always grateful however you are able to support the school, whether that be by helping out at events or making donations, sharing positive stories about Lowther and more—all of these things really do make a difference

This year we'd love to try and raise enough money to fund all of the following.

- 1) Fund a skip (or two) so that a team of volunteers can clear a part of the allotment area. We have plans to look at trying to set up a an exciting new programme to trial there for young children. We also need some fencing replaced in there too (We estimate that this will cost in total approximately £1.500)
- 2) We need a Nursery canopy so that children can use the outside area in all weathers. We already have this provision for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 but not for Nursery. We also have plans to try and open up even more of the playground for Early Years. (We believe this project will cost approximately £8000)
- 3) We have more technology than ever before which is absolutely brilliant. We do though need to provide appropriate good quality, secure storage for the 30 extra Chromebooks we have from the DfE and St Paul's School. (This would cost approximately £1000)

I'm sure you'll agree these would be amazing things to add to our already fantastic provision here at Lowther.

Do look out for the different events and opportunities to help support our quest to provide these additional resources for the children. Thank you in advance for continuing to support








Reception

Reception have absolutely loved being back at school and have settled back brilliantly into Lowther life. We are so incredibly proud of them!

We began last month by reading the story 'Colour Monster' and explored how we felt about coming back to school. We then read the story of 'The Enormous Turnip' and used this as an opportunity to explore planting and growing a little bit further. We looked closely at the different parts of a plant and then everyone had a go at planting their very own sunflower seed. The children have been looking after their seeds very well and we are excited to see how these grow and

change over the next month. We finished the month by learning about the Christian celebration of Easter. We read the Easter story and discussed the different ways that people choose to celebrate at home.

On the last day of term we were lucky enough to have our own Easter egg hunt on the allotmentit was so much fun!





The children have continued to develop their maths skills since being back at school. They have learned all about 3D and 2D shapes and some of the different language that we can use to describe them. The children have also been working hard to review their Phase 3 sounds and tricky words in their phonics sessions. We are impressed with how well their writing is developing and we think we might have a set of authors on our hands very soon!

We are all very excited to be back at school so that we

can continue with lots more learning. This term will be thinking about the season of Spring, celebrating St George's Day and then exploring some traditional tales. The fun in Reception never stops!





year ⁻

With great excitement over our return to school, we have got straight into our Space topic. In English, the children have been investigating famous astronauts and their day to day life in space. The children have been learning to write in the first person and write diary recounts of events. We have been continuing with teaching phase 5 phonics and are now really using and applying their reading skills. We have been trying some comprehension questions and really enjoying daily group guided reading as well.

In Maths, the children have been working on measurement. They have been comparing and measuring lengths in non-standard measurement (hands or string) and in cm. They then moved to measuring mass non-standard measurement (blocks) and in g and kg. Finally we moved on to measuring capacity and using comparative language.



In Art the focus has been paint and colour. The children have been exploring block colour work in the style of Kandinsky and recently tried some self portraits in the style of Picasso.

In Science, the children have been investigating materials. They have been aiming to build boats and so had to test waterproof materials,

floating and sinking, boat shapes and even how to propel their boats. We ended this unit of work with a very exciting boat race between the two classes.

In RE, the children have been learning about Special Foods. This led them through discussions about their own celebrations and events at home. We spent time learning about Jewish event Pesach and the special foods used, we then discussed the events that take place during Lent and the Christian celebration of Easter. This ended in a final end of term Easter fun day with egg hunts, races and arts and crafts. What a busy and fun half term!



Year 2

We are looking forward to our new topic' Homes and Habitats'. We will be focussing on our local area and thinking about any animals or plants that may be native to Barnes

What an awesome month April has been for Year 2! We have loved learning about all things Arctic and Antarctic. In English we learnt about the 'April of the Penguins' and wrote information booklets

explaining all about the treacherous journey that the penguins take each year.

In Maths we have been exploring shape. We can identify and name a range of 2D and 3D shapes and can describe their properties.

We have built on

our learning in gymnastics and have developed skills such as balances, jumps and rolls. Ask us to perform an arabesque, an arch or a dish- we've mastered them all! We really enjoyed using the apparatus and performing our new skills to the class.



In our 'Rainbow Learning' time we have loved making the most our construction area and have cooked up a storm in our mud kitchen.



We have started to do some gardening and have planted some seeds in our new planters. We are keeping an eye on them every day and making sure they are watered.



Year 3

Although only being back at school for 3 weeks in April, it was a busy and jam packed month! The children returned to school with great enthusiasm and excitement. We kicked off our return with celebrating world book day where the children showcased some of their favourite books and bedazzled us all with wonderful costumes. We all had a lot of fun celebrating a wide range of fantastic children's literature.

In English, we used our poetry skills to create some great Mother's Day poems before moving on to take ourselves on an adventure to Pompeii by delving into the book 'Vacation under a Volcano'. The children used their knowledge of descriptive writing techniques to create wonderful action packed stories based on the setting and characters of this book. In maths, the children have continued to widen and deepen their understanding of multiplication and division and are beginning to use formal written methods to multiply 2 digits by 1 digit numbers.



Science week was full of fun and practical experiments that explored a wide range of forces that are around us each day. We discussed how these forces can be harnessed to create innovative change for the better. In art, year 3 looked at a range of pictures and paintings that have emerged through

lockdown and these pieces of art can be reflective of feelings and emotions of this restrictive time. We linked this to our PSHE learning, identifying some feelings we experienced during the lockdown period and then chose pictures and colours to help express them through art. We then applied these to a multimedia self-portrait- using paint, collage and photography to bring it all together.

Year 3 had a lot of fun cooking over the last 3 weeks of the spring term and continued to serve up delicious dishes each

Thursday that allowed the children to compare and contrast modern day dishes to ones that were akin to the Stone Age times. We are looking forward to seeing what the summer term has in store!



Year 4

We're back! Year 4 have truly come back to school with a bang – ready to learn and take on new challenges!

In English, we have been focusing on working in depth with a text – 'Varjak Paw'. The children have been doing lots of guided reading and character studies as we continue to work on our inference, comprehension and prediction skills. We will also be using the book as stimulus for other work – whether that's exploring other forms of writing or writing creatively.

We are also going to be working on a small play this term so that the children will have the chance to flex their acting muscles! More information on this to follow in due course...



In Maths, alongside our ongoing work to improve

the fluency of our timestables, we have been working hard on fractions. We have been working on our understanding of what a fraction is whilst also adding and subtracting them and converting them to find equivalent fractions! Soon we will be moving on to decimals.

Since being back at school we have also had the opportunity to explore more of the wider curriculum in a way that we were unable to during Lockdown which has been so much fun! In History we have been exploring all things Roman, whilst in Science we have been

mastering electricity-learning all about insulators and conductors and experimenting with different circuits. Recently we have moved on to learning all about teeth as we begin our topic on digestion!



It has been so wonderful to be back together again and I cannot wait to see what the brilliant Year 4 team will achieve this term!


We also hope you have had a restful Easter, and we have enjoyed hearing about how much chocolate was eaten during the break!

We have also practised our dictionary skills to look up some of the old vocabulary in the poem and scribbled hasty warning notes on "parchment" while writing in role. Some of the children particularly enjoyed the freedom of not having to worry about their handwriting on this occasion.

In Maths, we are now starting to add and subtract decimals. We are also moving on to our new Geography topic, Mountains. We have already learnt about the tallest mountain in the world, the highest above sea level, and the tallest in the solar system!

Year 6

It has been another great term in Year 6! We have been so proud and pleased at how the children have returned with such an appetite to learn! In English, we have been building up character descriptions through dialogue using our class text of Skellig; exploring how David Almond has used figurative language to build atmosphere.

In Maths, the classes tackled algebraic expressions and equations with incredible surety, ratio and looked at the volume of compound shapes! This challenging work that they have absolutely ran with.





While in Science, we have been exploring the vast theme of evolution: How we have evolved through adaptation; looking at both our inherited and environmental traits and how they make each one of us unique!

We have been cracking codes in computing, creating digital cards using HTML and understanding the application of different types of tags within the code.

In the summer term we are looking forward to the many exciting opportunities that await; camping, cycling and of course the Isle of Wight!




