The service starts at 9:45am on Thursday 16th December and parents are welcome to join us any time from 9:15am.

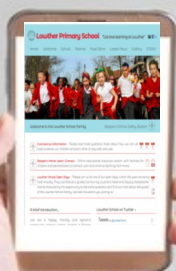
The church service is always a great way to finish the calendar year at school. The children have a lovely selection of songs, music and readings for you. We look forward to seeing you there.

Attendance Update!

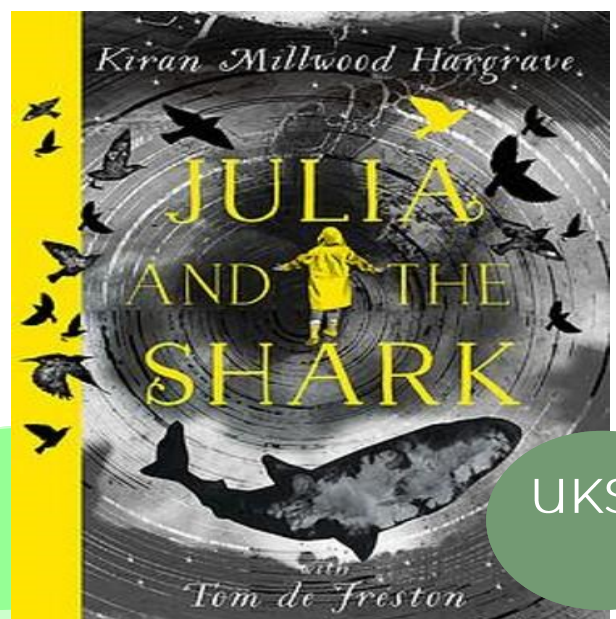
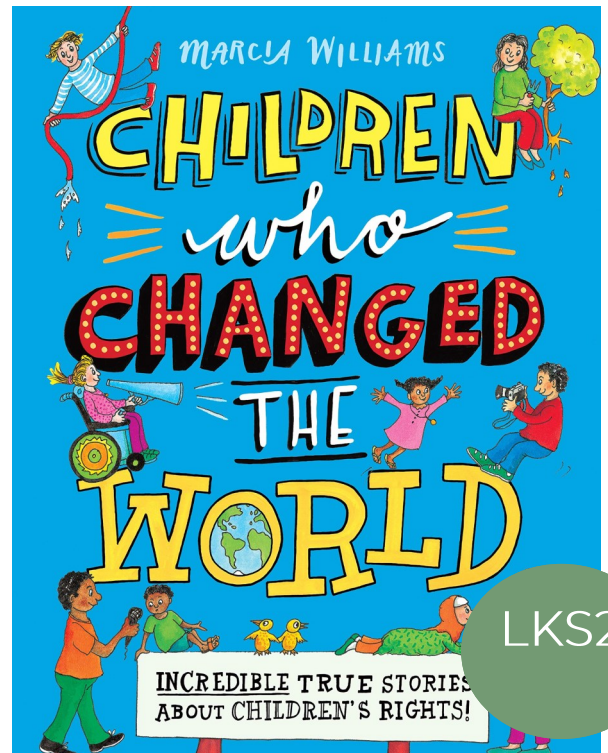
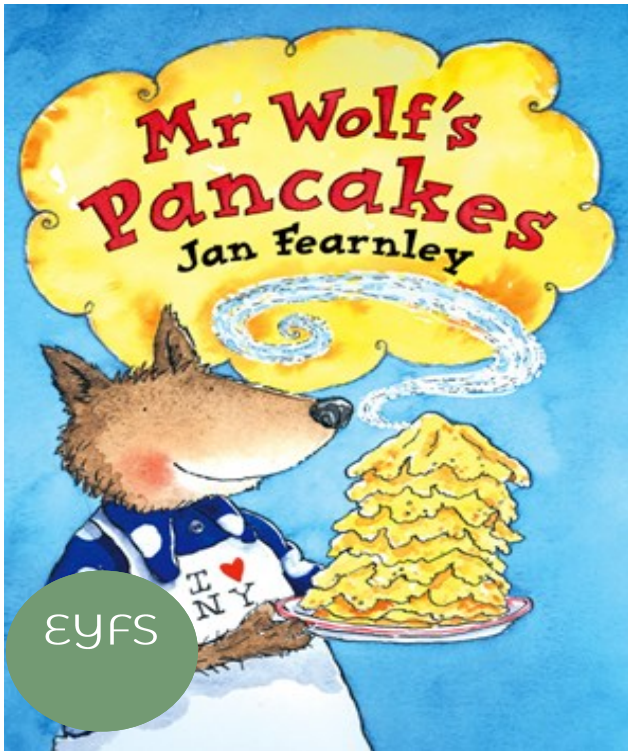
A key area for our school is to ensure attendance across the school is excellent. The minimum expectation for all pupils is 96% attendance. Attendance below this falls in to a category of concern. As you can see from the table our current school attendance is below 96% in each and every year group. To put the absence into context: 5% absence would equate to 58 hours (nearly 2 school weeks) of lost learning in a year per pupil and a whopping 348 hours during their time at primary school. This is the equivalent of missing a whole terms worth of learning. In previous years we have had very good attendance so we really appreciate your support in communicating to the children that every school day counts. The class attendance totals are indicated on the table. Please ask your child's teacher or at the office if you would like to know your child's attendance.

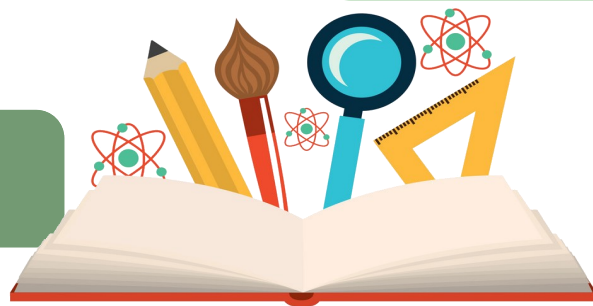

Year Group Updates



Nursery

As the Autumn term comes to an end, we wanted to say how proud we are of our Nursery children. They have had an amazing first term at Lowther and are now experts at following and joining in our daily routine. We sing a lot in the Nursery – whether it is the ‘days of the week’, counting songs, nursery rhymes, or songs to perform for special events such as Christmas (we are looking forward to performing some jolly numbers this year)! A particular favourite song this month has been the ‘Five Fruit and Veggies’ song.



We were given a very kind donation of plants, compost and bark chipping. The nursery children got to work quickly, enjoying planting and using trowels to empty the bags into our outside tyre area. They have also enjoyed the extra addition of ‘mud’ for the mud kitchen, and have been busy making ‘hot chocolate’ and all kinds of delicious muddy delights for us!

Did you know that we do phonics with the children in the nursery? In these early stages we are laying the foundations for the phonic skills that the children need to begin to blend further down the line. This term we have concentrated on listening to the sounds heard in our environment and exploring instruments. The children enjoyed making their own shakers and have used these in many different ways, such as shaking along to songs, finding different ways to make a sound or starting and stopping with a puppet.



This half term, our topic has been food and celebrations. We started our weekly cooking sessions with the children, which they have really enjoyed - particularly the results! We have also tasted some foods from around the world. We tasted food from Lebanon, Italy, Sweden, Jamaica, Bulgaria and India and enjoyed seeing what these different foods looked and smelled like.

Our nursery library is now in full swing, and we hope you and your children are enjoying taking home a book to share together each week!

In the last few weeks we have started to do more independent learning. We have chosen our own resources and activities and have been able to choose activities that we cannot see around us. We have enjoyed playing in the house outside using resources from our mud kitchen.

As the end of term approaches, we are sure the children will be looking forward to having a well-deserved rest and do hope you all enjoy the break!

Reception

Reception started the month of November by looking at Bonfire Night. We enjoyed watching videos of fireworks and sharing their own experiences of watching them. We explored using tools (e.g. potato mashers to toothbrushes) to make our very own, whizz, bang firework pictures.

Shortly after this we learnt about the special celebration of Diwali. We read the very exciting story of Rama and Sita then retold it using actions and then puppets. The children had lots of opportunities to create decorations to making their own mehndi hand designs.



Next up was Remembrance Day. We spent time talking about why we wear poppies and then creating our own poppies to plant in our sandpit in preparation for taking part in the two minute silence. All the children were incredibly thoughtful and sensible during this time.

We have finished the month off with a mini topic all about light and dark. We loved learning about nocturnal animals reading the book ‘Flashlight’. We impressed everyone using our fantastic writing skills to create a list of items we had to prepare for a game to Nursery to play. Finally, finally we learnt about the special celebration of Hanukkah. We read the story, learnt how it is celebrated, sang songs, made hats and played a game. Wowee what fun!

At the end of this month in our maths learning we have loved learning about the numbers 4 and 5 – they are pretty special to us!

December brings lots more exciting learning, all about the celebration of Christmas. We are really looking forward to performing our first Nativity show! As well as making decorations, cooking some Christmas treats and if we are really lucky we might even get a visit from a certain elf on the shelf.



Year Group Updates



Year 1

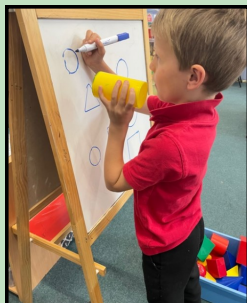
In Year 1, the children have been busy engaging with their new topic 'The Enchanted Forest'. In English, we have been learning about different styles of writing by becoming immersed in our topic and retelling traditional fairy tales. We are excited to begin exploring fractured fairy tales towards this week.



As part of this topic, we have had some very exciting provision activities available. We have had Lowther Fairies who came to visit. The children were busy writing messages

to the fairies and even receiving tiny messages back to read!

In Maths, the children have been working on their understanding of number bonds. Children have been learning to work systematically to solve a missing number problem and developing mental maths skills.



We are now building up to the end of term with rehearsals for, and the performances of a very special Nativity show – It's beginning to feel a lot like Christmas!



Year 2

In Year 2 we have been exploring 'Heroes and Villains'. We thought about what it means to be a hero or a villain and discussed people through History that would fit these headings. We have used positive reflection times to think about what these amazing people have done for us and how they have changed the lives of so many.

In Maths we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We have also started learning about money and focussed on making different amounts.

We learnt about Remembrance Day and thought about why we remember the 11th of November. To mark this special day, we made poppy collages and created poppies using clay.



In English we have started to think about Christmas. Children have written letters to Santa and have sent them off to the North Pole. Hopefully we will hear back from Santa soon!

The children have been working hard in Phonics- particularly on blending tricky split digraphs! They all completed their Phonics Screening Check earlier this month and totally smashed it!

This term has been a fabulous time of learning in Year 2!

Year Group Updates



Year 3

We have had a fantastic term, and have been so impressed with your children's attitude and application at school.

In our Geography topic, we have been learning about Earthquakes and Volcanos, where children have identified areas of the world that are vulnerable to these. This has also linked to our English book, The Magic Treehouse, where Year 3 are writing a story about time travelling to Pompeii, as Mount Vesuvius is erupting. They are using their knowledge of this topic to create some amazing, exciting noun phrases. We also had a stimulating virtual workshop with the National History Museum, where all pupils became volcanologists (what a word!). They even received their own diploma for completing the course. What a group!



In Maths we have completed our Addition and Subtraction topic, and are astounded at how brilliantly pupils have learnt to add and subtract 3 digit numbers in a column.

Rocks is now our Science topic, and pupils have identified igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks. We have learnt how these are formed, and have even used chocolate to show the formation of the types of rock.

Year 4

Christmas spirit has been in full swing in Year 4 this month! We have been working really hard but enjoying all the festive cheer too.

In English, we have been busy learning about palm oil and how its production affects our planet. We researched the positive contribution palm oil has made to society but also the negative impact it has had. To conclude this work we then wrote some balanced arguments explaining these ideas. Maybe have a chat with your child about their opinions on palm oil?

In Maths we have continued to work on addition and subtraction skills and how to use bar models to help us reasoning. We have now moved on to looking at length and perimeter and the children are doing a great job with this!

In geography we have been looking at sustainability. The children have investigated how sustainable our school is and are busy making action plans as to how we could improve further. This linked really nicely with our English planning and it has been lovely learning in such a cross curricular approach. Sustainability has also been centre stage in Science where we investigated the delicate balance in which ecosystems exist. Children made their own documentary animations about the importance of elephants to their ecosystem. We then moved on to our new topic of sound in which children investigated how different sounds are made and how sound travels through a medium.

We have been lucky enough to have some extra-curricular activities go on this term. We really enjoyed a virtual author visit with Jeff Kinney who writes the 'Diary of a Wimpy Kid' series. Lots of children were really inspired by this to go and read some more of his books. We also went to the panto recently and had the best time joining in with the call and response sections (oh no we didn't.....oh yes we did!).

Finally the children have had an amazing time practicing and performing their Christmas song – I hope you enjoy watching them too! Have a very Merry Christmas from all of us in Year 4 – we can't wait to see what the New Year has in store!



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Year Group Updates



Year 5

Year 5 have had a really busy second half of the autumn term so far and have stepped up to meet the challenges of a wide range of activities. Our work on poetic style in English at the start of November produced some fabulous writing, with the children using similes, metaphors, alliteration, onomatopoeia and personification to great effect. Top-quality writing was also on display in our first Phase Write-Off of the year, when the Year 6 children found it tough to choose between two excellent Greek myths written in Year 5. Just a handful of votes separated first and second place. We have now moved on to study Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol and the year group's celebrated strengths in drama have already come to the fore and provided several chilling portrayals of Ebenezer Scrooge. In Maths we have worked with factors, multiples, square and cube numbers and have been revising multiplying and dividing by 10 and its multiples. Six of the group also joined the Year 6 children to take part in the national Primary Maths Challenge and did very well having joined the competition a year early. We have begun learning about the Mayans in History and cross-curricular links with cooking have enabled us to taste a range of tasty food that would have been produced in Central America 4,000 years ago. Takeover Day featured four very high-quality Art lessons and in Music our first workshop with Mark Wilderspin was a tremendous success. The director of music at St Paul's will be incorporating the children's ideas in his own composition, which we will be performing with a number of other schools next year.

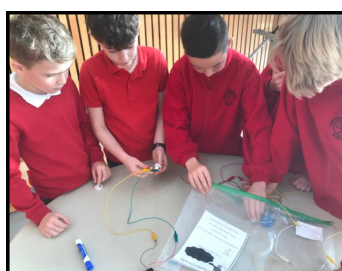
Nine members of the class represented the school strongly in cross country, coming in for early-morning training and reaping their reward when they did extremely well running against hundreds of other children in Richmond Park. We have also been learning rugby skills in PE, swimming at St Paul's and running the Daily Mile. It has been great to see such a fit and healthy group of children learning new skills and pushing themselves in so many different areas.



Year 6

It has been another exciting time of learning in Year 6, with trips and new learning aplenty! In Maths, the children have been working hard on new concepts such as multiplying and dividing fractions. The secret of their success is knowing when to keep, change and flip - this was demonstrated very enthusiastically with our round-the-grounds fraction hunt!

In English, we started the poignant story of Anne Frank; looking at our broader theme of World War II from another perspective. Researching life in Germany and the Netherlands before the war, we examine the life and the legacy of this ordinary girl put in an extraordinary situation. We also paid our respects to those who suffered and struggled during the conflict in Britain, by visiting St Mary's Church War Memorial where the local chaplain spoke to the children about the experiences of local people during both wars.



In Science, we have been building on our prior knowledge of electricity by looking at key vocabulary, and misconceptions about how electricity travels. While for computing, we were incredibly lucky to visit the National Army Museum. A fascinating place to visit, Year 6 took part in the workshop 'Robots to the Rescue' and using block code, explored how robotic devices help the army in their missions, both in peacetime and during conflict.

Staying on the Science and Technology theme, we organised a terrific STEM day workshop, exploring how science, technology, engineering and maths plays a part in our world. Through a series of engaging experiments, we investigated how forces can be enhanced through strong design. Congratulations to those successful groups of engineers who landed their eggs!

And of course it would be amiss not to mention the wonderful new Ms Chalbot's and Mr Ripley's who arrived for work at Lowther on takeover day; organising terrific lessons from PE to computing, art to spelling!

E-SAFETY@ Lowther

I would particularly like to guide parents to the advice around gaming. Now that games are increasingly being played online and between virtual gamers this is a key area for parents to monitor and supervise. Please also take note of the age ratings. Games that are rated 3 or 7 DO NOT have any legal guidelines, they are merely to advise parents on the suitability of the game for children of different ages. However 12, 16 and 18 rated games do have LEGAL guidelines and it is a criminal offence for a retailer to knowingly sell a game to a child under age.

I have mentioned in previous letters about games like Fortnite which are very popular with children. Did you know that Fortnite is a category 12 game? This is mainly because of the frequent mild violence in the game. This does mean no child at Lowther should be playing this game.

Roblox is another game popular with children. Please ensure you follow the age-appropriate guidelines as this game has a chat feature. Roblox offers parental controls that allow for a selection of chat options (no chat, chat with friends, chat with everyone), account age visibility (13+ or <13), an account PIN code feature, and an Account Restrictions setting that only allows children under 13 to access a curated list of age-appropriate games.

Please support your child with appropriate use of technology. Thank you with your support of this important matter.

Left to right, they are for iPod Touch/iPhone/iPad; Android phones and tablets; Kindle Fire; Microsoft Xbox; Nintendo products and Sony PlayStation.
