National average 82% Richmond average 87% Kingston average 84%


### Mark and Dermot


This graph shows each classes attendance from September until December 2020.

Our children made super posters to ask when can the bridge be open again. Their brilliant work was much admired and appreciated by the local community. Great job children.








# We recommend these books as a super read


This month all our recommended books are from a new selection of books we have at school which feature main characters from different ethnic and cultural backgrounds. Happy reading everyone!






## Reception

## Year 1

In Year 1 this term we have been extremely busy with winter festivities. We have been learning about religious and non-religious celebrations which we share in our class and have had some children acting as wonderful guest speakers sharing their experiences from home. We have been learning about celebrations such as Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, Hanukkah and Christmas. This has also led to learning about special places of worship in R.E. and talking about places they feel at peace and calm.

In History, we have been investigating the great London Frost Fair of 1684. The children have been discussing the incredible events that occurred such as bringing an elephant down to the frozen River Thames, roasting a whole ox and celebrating with the King and Queen.



Following our formal letters written to the Prime Minister and the Queen, some of the children were invited onto the Pod Save the Queen Podcast. We recorded the podcast this week and we look forward to airing it and sharing it with you.

In Maths, the children have been deepening their understanding of addition and subtraction. Practising their number bonds and mental maths skills. In English we have been working on fractured fairy tales and the children have greatly enjoyed arguing their points of view from the wolf's perspective!

Finally, we have of course been working extremely hard on our Nativity. We have had so much fun planning, rehearsing and filming the scenes for our first ever Nativity movie - we can't wait to share it and we hope you enjoy it too!

## Year 2

December has been a busy month in Year 2! We got to work practising for our nativity 'Lights, Camel Action'. This year we did things slightly

differently and recorded the show scene by scene. We then got a golden ticket sent home telling us about a special premiere (which we had on Thursday). We got to wear our party clothes into school and had a celebration of all the hard work that we had put into our nativity. We even got to watch ourselves on the big screen! We stayed on the



Christmas theme in English writing letters to Santa and sending them off to the North Pole. We have had a great time in Science investigating materials. First we made chairs for the wicked witch in Hansel and Gretel focussing on comfort and stability. Then we turned our attention to Santa and thought about what materials would be best for him to make his sack from- after all it needs to be strong and sturdy to carry around all

have been busy making Christmas cards for communities in Malaysia who have been hit by an earthquake and hope to share some Christmas cheer with them. Year 3 are looking forward to sitting back and enjoying the 'Jack and the Beanstalk' Panto, as well as visiting Santa in this final week of term. In other



areas of the curriculum, the children have loved getting stuck into some fossil making and learning about the fossilisation process. In P.E, we ended the term with a mini netball tournament, where the children showcased their fantastic skills and demonstrated wonderful teamwork- they had a ball! In English, the children have loved exploring the story of the 'Bear and the Hare' and created some wonderful dialogue between the two characters to illustrate their caring and kind friendship.
