Register (by Thursday) for Free School Meals to help your school

If your child is eligible for free school meals, it's worth registering them even if they're not going to have the school lunch. This is because schools receive a 'Pupil Premium' - an extra payment for each eligible child which they can spend on useful services.

Schools receive a payment for each child who is registered for free school meals - £488 for this school year and £600 next school year. This money helps them to provide extra support like extra tuition, learning assistants or after-school clubs.

Eligibility

You can apply for free school meals if you or your child receives any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' - the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

How to apply

If you want to register for free school meals for your child, contact the school office. You may need to provide a letter to prove that you're receiving one of these benefits - your local Jobcentre Plus should be able to help with this.
