- **Keep working on your handwriting.** Make sure your letters are evenly sized, that your ascenders and descenders are clear and that all your writing is on the line. We want to be able to read those wonderful ideas!
- **Keep practicing your mental maths skills.** Knowing your 2, 5 and 10 times tables and your number bonds to 10 and 20, and being able to recall these quickly, can make all the difference as we tackle trickier maths problems in Year 3!
- **Keep reading!** Reading is fun and there are endless stories to discover! Little and often is the key, and don't forget to keep discussing what you've read with your grown-ups.

They studied Ancient Greece and the Maya civilisation enthusiastically in the autumn term and also enjoyed learning about Elizabeth I and the Spanish Armada in the summer. Rivers and Mountains were really popular Geography topics, with our trip to the Thames putting our learning into a real life context. In English, the children loved learning about the conquest of Mount Everest and produced some excellent recounts. Art was a favourite subject for many children and we were blown away by their creativity!

Curriculum Enrichment

The children responded really well to the many extra learning opportunities in Year 5. They enjoyed learning how to recognise Greek gods at the British Museum and loved watching a 3D film about the International Space Station at the Science Museum. Searching for living creatures in The River Thames was another highlight, while virtually the whole class turned up after school to sing brilliantly in the Barnes Music Festival. Wednesday afternoons epitomised the range and number of opportunities on offer, with children attending Classics at St Paul's, working in the allotment, singing in the school choir or doing art in the classroom.

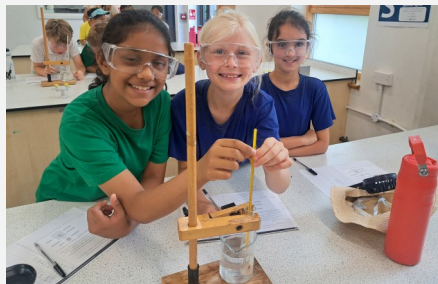
